

Information for campus visitors taking part in a guided tour

We are delighted that you have chosen to visit the University of Veterinary Medicine in Vienna (Vetmeduni).

Tours usually meet at the main entrance/security booth (entrance barrier), Veterinärplatz 1, 1210 Vienna, unless agreed otherwise.

To ensure you have a smooth and pleasant visit, please note the following:

- Guided tours are by appointment only (www.vetmeduni.ac.at/fuehrungen)
- Persons who have not registered in advance may not take part in the guided tour. Accompanying persons who are not taking part in the tour are welcome to wait in the cafeteria.
- We request that visitors conduct themselves in a quiet and respectful manner so as not to disturb the operations of the veterinary clinic. Please turn off your mobile phones.
- It is not allowed to feed or pet the animals on campus. This is especially intended to prevent the risk of bite injuries and infections.
- We ask for your understanding that photographing our animal patients is not allowed.
- Allergy and asthma sufferers should take note that they may be exposed to dust and allergens during the visit.
- When touring the campus with groups of children or young people, we ask the adults in charge to ensure that the rules are followed and that the group stays together.
- The University of Veterinary Medicine Vienna generally prohibits dogs from being brought onto the campus. This does not include animal patients, registered dogs and certified assistance dogs.
- Visitors must follow the instructions given by the Vetmeduni staff and agree to comply with the House Rules and the Rules and Regulations of the Animal Hospital.
